Parish Council message

- The Parish Council is grateful and thankful to all who continue to support, through their prayers and efforts, the parish in general focusing on both the Church's day-to-day responsibilities and activities as well as the process to construct new worship facilities.
- The Church of St Mary appreciates the recent actions taken by the City of Melrose through the unanimous decisions of both the Planning and Zoning Commission and the City Council to approve the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) necessary for construction of new church facilities on our new site and the Height Variance to allow the new church facilities to adequately symbolize our faith through their height.
- During the approval process for the Conditional Use Permit and the Height Variance, the City raised its legitimate concern regarding the fire-damaged former church structure and its fear that the possible need to address the building as a nuisance or hazardous structure could become a liability for the City. Allowing that to happen is not and never has been the Church's intent. The Church has always realized its responsibilities for the fire-damaged structure and will continue to do so. To address the City's concerns, the Church proposed and entered into an Abatement Agreement with the City. The Abatement Agreement assures the City that the City will not be responsible for or vulnerable for any costs or liability pertaining to any nuisance or hazardous condition related to the fire-damaged structure
- We are grateful for the work and participation by members of the city council, mayor, administration and staff of the City of Melrose for all of their work and collaboration in this process!

--Chris Calderone On Liturgy – Musical Instruments

The latest work on our new church has me focusing on the proposed choir area, as well as options for an organ. These areas, obviously close to my profession, inspired me to review the Church documents on sacred music and its relation to liturgy. Once again, Vatican II provides a "turning point" in the Church's understanding of this relation-

We begin once again with the Council's new Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, which confirms that the pipe organ "is to be held in high esteem in the Latin church, for it is the traditional musical instrument". However, the document specifies that "other instruments may also be used in divine worship", provided they are suitable, dignified, and "contribute to the edification of the faithful". The General Instructions of the Roman Missal concisely rephrases this statement, giving the organ "pride of place" and stating that other instruments may be used – again, as long as they are "suitable". In 2007, US Bishops released "Sing to the Lord", an updated document on music in divine worship. This document, too, maintains the organ's "pride of place", but references the variety of instruments used to accompany the Ark of the Covenant in the Old Testament in regard to other musical instruments. Churches today - including our new church's latest designs reflect this position, allocating space in the music area for a variety of instruments, often in addition to an organ, all for God's glory.


